Journal Entry from Missionary without Borders, Denise Sager

South India, Feb 6, 12:10 AM:

In Bangalore, for several days we have been teaching leadership to church planters who travel as missionaries from the South of India to North India. Pastors are just too needed now to have to wait the number of years before they're graduated. There are at least 30,000 Indian Christians for every trained pastor!! So this lay pastoral program of two years (at most) gets more Indian Christian men and women into the field to lead ministry. At the leadership conference with church planters and Christian pastors, they seemed exactly like what we read in the Bible of the early church. They share the Gospel where it's never been heard before; they heal the sick, cast out demons, and face severe persecution with even death threats.

We spent time at the end of teaching each day with each of us individually laying on hands with prayer and anointing of men, women, and children. Using our hands is so powerful here with the caste system still in effect, with its accompanying belief that defilement can happen when one touches a lower caste person, 65% of the population! People display a deep desire for human touch. It is truly healing. Combined with prayer and praise, the combination is unstoppable!

Some of those gathered at the conference have come by bus over several days' time to meet here, and they are having a reunion with sisters and brothers in Christ. They are so moved to be with each other and to have freedom to worship. We sing together in strong voices and with drums. These Christian leaders sacrifice much for the Gospel, and we pray and praise long and often in between times of teaching and testimony. We speak of the sufficiency of Jesus for the suffering church. One of the church fathers, Tertullian, said that Christianity without suffering is not normal! Wherever there is true faithful Christianity, there is suffering. As long as we are in the world, we will have persecution and suffering,

God loves you and so do we!

Jesus taught. Christ is sufficient. His grace is sufficient. These words have deep meaning for all of us through this shared experience.

When the Indian Christian leaders declare in their native languages what the Lord Jesus is accomplishing through them, the translators are often so moved as to have to stop speaking to gasp and then immediately give praise to God for what they have just heard uttered, and must now find words in English to explain in translation to us! Such is their immediate response to the miracle they hear! When we hear of the miracles, we are all so moved. Here are notes from a few of their personal witnesses which sound like first century Christians, only located today in India.

One Indian man, a former devotee of a guru (“god-man”), thought Christianity was a foreign religion with a foreign god. Someone witnessed to him that when he was in difficulty, just to remember the name of Jesus. When his daughter became quite ill, he grew heart sick and thought to drink poison and end his own life. Some women were praying for him. Another time he was implicated in a false accusation. Though several life experiences, he came to know Jesus Christ and trusted him more. Today as a baptized Christian leader, he works in four different villages as an evangelist. He established two worship centers with sixty people. He can read and testify about Jesus since accepting him, despite a low level of education. Once, in a Brahmin (highest class in the Hindu caste system) village, they surrounded him when he was testifying about Jesus and beat him with sticks. A girl between 8 and 9 years of age was brought to him, blind from birth. He was told to heal her or face immediate death. He called on the power of the Lord and used aloud the name of Jesus to proclaim healing on the girl. The girl could miraculously see for the first time. The Brahmin Hindus continued to threaten his life, but the family of the girl defended him and he was safe from danger. (There was no dry eye in that room when he quietly spoke this testimony. There were often tears of joy among us, likely in heaven, too.)

Upper class Brahmin men may wear a thin pony tail (Choti) over the top of their other hair. One young Christian Indian evangelist demonstrated this custom. He is Brahmin and wears a Choti, citing that he is like the evangelist Paul, who became all things to all people. Upper class Brahmins often live in North India and do not tolerate Christians. This young man fearlessly goes into those places and preaches aloud in crowds. “Who is he? What is he doing?” he hears the people say. They see his Choti and say, “Oh, he is one of us. Well, he is not bothering anyone. Let him do what he is doing.” God is healing the sick and freeing the demon-possessed people. Families are seeing these miracles and trusting in the true God. This young man works in five different villages. He is discipling 5 different people to come and also to preach the Gospel. He has two churches and every day offers prayers in a different village. [In north India, in the city of Agra, I attended a worship service in which he baptized several people in a baptismal pool with another young

Christian partner in the Gospel. There was much joy in welcoming the new Christians into the congregation! The signing was so loud and heartfelt that the music and praises carried freely in the air, witnessing to the power of Christ throughout the poor neighborhood.]

Formerly Hindu, but now a fearless Christian leader, Pastor Navratan Singh shared the need for a larger place to assemble the believers. So they are finding land in a slum and building a church. They are doing baptisms in the River Ganges; such is the need for believers to be adopted into the family of Christians. [We met him again in Agra, northwest India. His 12-year-old son Ruben was playing keyboards and drums for an amazing worship service, plus conducting a large group of singing and dancing children from a Christian after-school program. Pastor Singh’s other son, Justin Paul aged 18, led worship and I learned has been accepted at Christ for the Nations, where he will live and learn through this evangelizing training program based out of Dallas, Texas. He is only months older than our son Andrew. I offered that we will be his family in America. Pastor Singh was visibly grateful for this news when translated, and he smiles and praises our Lord Jesus.]

These Christians are fearless, claiming the power of Jesus and being equipped with the Holy Spirit’s gifts to share the Gospel with others, especially in the low caste neighborhoods. They share that Jesus is the true way. Broken families, worshiping many gods, turn to Christ through powerful door-to-door sharing of the Gospel, with praying and telling about Jesus. Hundreds and thousands of people have been reached in North India. The harvest is plentiful. Laborers needed!
